PhRMA Foundation Health Outcomes - Pre Doctoral Fellowships - The aims of the Pre Doctoral Fellowships are (1) to provide stipend support to promising students during advanced stages of training and thesis research; and (2) to support the career development of scientists prepared to engage in health outcomes research. Health Outcomes research spans a broad spectrum of issues related to health-care delivery, from studies evaluating effectiveness of a pharmaceutical intervention, to the impact of reimbursement policies on outcomes of care. It also ranges from the development and use of tools to perform patient-based assessments to analyses of ways in which results of outcomes research are disseminated to providers or consumers to encourage behavior change.
