P.E.O. Scholars Awards - P.E.O. Scholar Awards are one-time, competitive, merit-based awards for women of the United States and Canada who are pursuing a doctoral level degree at an accredited college or university. Drug Abuse Dissertation Research (R36) - The goal of this FOA is to enhance the diversity of the drug abuse research workforce by providing dissertation awards on topics related to the study of basic and clinical neuroscience, development, epidemiology, prevention, treatment, services, or women and sex/gender differences as they relate to drug abuse. This support will enhance the pool of highly talented drug abuse scientists who conduct research within the funding priority areas (<u>http://www.drugabuse.gov/funding/funding-priorities</u>) or in the NIDA strategic plan (<u>https://www.drugabuse.gov/about-nida/2016-2020-nida-strategic-plan</u>). Applications are encouraged from doctoral candidates in a variety of academic disciplines and programs. The Fellow will receive a \$50,000 per year stipend in each of the first two years. The institutions in which the research will be conducted would be paid overhead in addition to the salary stipend. American Lung Association Lung Health Dissertation Grant - The objective of this grant is to support pre-doctoral dissertation research in the various disciplines of social science examining risk factors affecting lung health including: Psychosocial research, Behavioral research, Health services and health policy research, Epidemiology / Biostatics research, Public Health Education research. Awards are for \$21,000 per award year. Up to \$16,000 of the award may be used for a student stipend. Funds may not be used for tuition. The award will terminate at the time the awardee is granted a doctoral degree.
