Student Research Opportunities and Fellowships

Health Outcomes - Pre Doctoral Fellowships - The aims of the Pre Doctoral Fellowships are (1) to provide stipend support to promising students during advanced stages of training and thesis research; and (2) to support the career development of scientists prepared to engage in health outcomes research. Health Outcomes research spans a broad spectrum of issues related to health-care delivery, from studies evaluating effectiveness of a pharmaceutical intervention, to the impact of reimbursement policies on outcomes of care. It also ranges from the development and use of tools to perform patient-based assessments to analyses of ways in which results of outcomes research are disseminated to providers or consumers to encourage behavior change. Applications must be submitted by an accredited U.S. college or university. This program supports full-time, in-residence students who will have completed most of their pre-thesis requirements (at least two years of study) and be engaged in thesis research as Ph.D. candidates by the time the award is active. Health Outcomes - Post Doctoral Fellowships - The aims of these fellowships are (1) to provide stipend support for individuals engaged in a research training program that will extend their credentials in health outcomes; and (2) to support the post doctoral career development of individuals prepared to engage in research that will strengthen representation of health outcomes in schools of pharmacy, medicine, nursing, and public health. Health Outcomes research spans a broad spectrum of issues related to health-care delivery, from studies evaluating effectiveness of a pharmaceutical intervention, to the impact of reimbursement policies on outcomes of care. It also

ranges from the development and use of tools to perform patient-based assessments to analyses of ways in which results of outcomes research are disseminated to providers or consumers to encourage behavior change. Applicants must have a firm commitment from a sponsor/mentor at an accredited U.S. university. Applicants must hold a Ph.D., Pharm.D., or M.D. degree. Applicants are encouraged to apply at the earliest point possible in their post doctoral research. All applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents. **Application Due Date: February 1**,

The aims of the fellowships are (1) to support students in advanced stages of training and thesis research and (2) to encourage the entry of well-trained investigators into the informatics field. The goal of the Informatics program is to promote development and use of novel informatics in an integrative approach toward understanding normal processes of human biology and disease processes. Due to the high demand for this fellowship, the PhRMA Foundation will accept only two applications per academic institution. International Health Studies - At the May 2001 Annual Meeting, the Massachusetts Medical Society House of Delegates adopted Report: 411, A-01(D), which established an annual international health studies grant program to be administered by the Massachusetts Medical Society and Alliance Charitable Foundation (Foundation), with input from the Committees on Global Health and Medical Education. Grants are to defray the costs of study abroad and to encourage international education, particularly focusing on underserved populations. All selected grant recipients will be invited and expected to showcase their lessons learned at a Medical Society sponsored event. Preference will be given to projects providing health care related work and/or training of staff; and to applicants planning careers serving underprivileged populations in the world. Research projects that do not involve direct clinical care or teaching WILL NOT be considered. **Application Due Date: September 15**,
