U.S. South Pacific Scholarship Program and United States Timor-Leste

Scholarship Program - The USSP Scholarship Program was established by the United States Congress to provide opportunities for U.S. study to students from South Pacific nations in fields important for the region's future development. Public Law 103-236 authorized academic scholarships to qualified students from the sovereign island nations of the South Pacific region to pursue undergraduate and graduate study at institutions of higher education in the United States. Fields of study are based on recommendations from U.S. Department of State regional bureau representatives and Public Affairs Sections (PAS) at U.S. embassies in the region and include public administration, public health, STEM fields (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics), education, environmental studies, agriculture, business, NGO management, political science, gender studies, journalism, and others. Students selected for these scholarships enroll in undergraduate degree programs or in master's degree programs. South Pacific student applicants will not require pre-academic English

training, but at the master's level may benefit from up to one year of preparatory study in the U.S. prior to enrolling in a formal master's degree program if they possess the three-year baccalaureate degree commonly offered in the Pacific Islands region. **Application Due Date: May 29, 2017.** https://www.grants.gov/web/grants/view-opportunity.html?oppld=292911
