Earbuds & Smart Phones as Hearing Aids

Although not formally announced, in recent years Apple has pushed out additions to both the iPhone and AirPods that can allow them to work like hearing aids and has added Beats to the devices that can use Apple's Listen Live feature on iOS.

Samsung's Galaxy Buds Pro are also touted as functioning as entry level hearing aids when paired with Samsung phones running Android 11 or later with 1.5 GB of RAM and the Galaxy Wearable app.

Note that there is almost no cross compatibility, so you will need to choose an ecosystem and stick with it.

iPhone

iOS hearing assist features include:

Live Listen

<u>Live listen</u> uses the microphones in your earbuds to feed processed external sounds into your ears.

You must add the hearing icon to the control center to use Listen Live.

Conversation Boost

<u>Conversation Boost</u> focuses your AirPods Pro on the person talking in front of you but can mute other important sounds.

Active Noise Cancellation and Transparency

<u>Active Noise Cancellation</u> uses microphones to detect external sounds and using anti-noise, cancel the external sounds.



Transparency lets outside noise in, allowing you to hear the sounds around you.

Amplify Mode / Stereo

Stereo mode uses the left and right channels of your music. <u>Amplify mode</u> puts the exact same sounds into both ear buds.

Live Captions

<u>Live captions</u> are still in beta (testing) but they turn spoken dialog into text displayed on your phone.

Sound Recognition

<u>Sound recognition</u> notifies you when it recognizes certain sounds (doorbell, sirens, crying babies).

Subtitles and Captions

<u>Subtitles and captions</u> give you subtitles in video programs that provide it.

Using iOS Headphone Accommodations

- 1. Take a hearing test and upload your audiogram.
- 2. Update audio accessibility settings.
 - a. Open your settings
 - b. click accessibility
 - c. Select AirPods
 - d. Select audio accessibility settings
 - e. Select headphone accommodations
 - f. Select "tune audio for audiogram."

Change the Transparency Mode in iOS

- 1. Settings
- 2. Accessibility
- 3. Audio/Visual
- 4. Headphone Accommodations
- 5. Scroll to the bottom of the screen and tap "Transparency Mode"


Adding the Hearing Icon to the iOS Control Center

- Settings
- 2. Control Center
- 3. Scroll down and tap the Add button add icon next to the Hearing button hearing icon.

Using Live Listen with iOS

- 1. Open Control Center
- 2. Tap the Hearing icon
- 3. Tap the Live Listen icon
- 4. Place your iPhone or iPad in front of the person that you want to hear. Adjust the volume on your device if needed.





Samsung Android

Galaxy Buds Pro are compatible with smartphones and tablets running Android 7.0 or later and with more than 1.5GB of RAM

Hearing aid support

Optimize the sound quality for use with hearing aids, or use Bluetooth to pair compatible hearing aids.

Amplify ambient sound

Using your headphones, you can increase the volume of conversations around you.

Adapt Sound

Find the appropriate sound based on your age range, or create your own personalized sound.





Mono audio

Easily switch between stereo and mono audio.

Live transcribe

Download the Live Transcribe app to hear live speech.

Live caption

Live Caption on Android will automatically caption media playing on your phone. Any video, podcast and audio message, across any app

Subtitle settings

Choose between Samsung or Google subtitles if you'd like subtitles to appear on your screen when playing videos with embedded subtitles.

Sound detectors

Receive alerts when a baby is crying or when a doorbell rings.

Customize ambient sound


